Her professional journey included serving as the Group Treasurer of the British Airports Authority during the privatization era under Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher. Additionally, she held a position on the Board of Heathrow Express. Her financial acumen also benefited the London Ambulance Service, where she served as a Financial Advisor. Notably, she was appointed by Lord Rabbi Jonathan Sacks to the Jewish Association of Business Ethics Committee.

Beyond her achievements in the corporate world, she dedicated her time to the not-for-profit sector. She assumed the role of Chair at the British Eye Research Foundation and played a pivotal role when it merged with Fight for Sight, the largest eye research charity in the UK, eventually becoming its President. In an historic achievement, she became the first woman and first British citizen to hold the prestigious position of President at The Explorers Club. Her deep involvement in exploration

and scientific discovery is exemplified through her active sponsorship and participation in numerous programs offered by the Club.

# Dr. Joel N. Myers

Dr. Joel N. Myers, Founder and Executive Chairman of AccuWeather, is considered the "father of modern commercial meteorology" and the nation's most respected authority on the business of weather. A visionary entrepreneur who The New York Times named "the most accurate man in weather," Dr. Myers started AccuWeather as a graduate student in 1962 and built the company into a global leader in forecast accuracy, weatherrelated big data, business, and predictive analytics. Today, AccuWeather is recognized as the most accurate and most used source of weather forecasts and warnings in the world, serving more than half of Fortune 500 companies and over 1.5 billion people. AccuWeather's proven Superior Accuracy<sup>™</sup> has saved tens of thousands of lives and prevented hundreds of billions of dollars in property losses. Dr. Myers has been recognized in Entrepreneur Magazine's Encyclopedia of Entrepreneurs book as one of the greatest entrepreneurs in American history. He is also a Trustee of the Committee for Economic Development (CED), a Fellow of The Explorer's Club, a Fellow of the Nantucket Project, and was an active Member of the Penn State Board of Trustees for 33 years. His new book, Invisible Iceberg: How Climate and Weather Have Shaped History, is due out in 2024.

# John D. Negroponte

Ambassador John D. Negroponte is Vice Chair of McLarty Associates, which he joined in 2009, following a distinguished career in diplomacy and national security. Ambassador Negroponte held government positions abroad and in Washington between 1960 and 1997 and again from 2001 to 2008.

He has served as Ambassador to Honduras, Mexico, the Philippines, the United Nations, and Iraq. In Washington he served twice on the White House National Security Council staff, first as Director for Vietnam in the Nixon Administration and then as Deputy National Security Advisor under President Reagan. He has also held a cabinet level position as the first Director of National Intelligence under President George W. Bush.

His most recent position in government was as Deputy Secretary of State, where he served as the State Department's Chief Operating Officer.

While in the private sector from 1997 to 2001, Ambassador Negroponte was Executive Vice President of the McGraw-Hill Companies, with responsibility for overseeing the company's international activities. During those years he was also Chairman of the French-American Foundation. Since 2009, Ambassador Negroponte has held teaching positions at Yale, the George Washington University, the University of Virginia, and Georgetown.

Ambassador Negroponte serves as Chairman Emeritus of the Council of the Americas/Americas Society. He is Co-chairman of the US-Philippines Society and a past member of the Secretary of State's Foreign Affairs Policy Board. He has also served as Chairman of the Intelligence and National Security Alliance.

Ambassador Negroponte has received numerous awards in recognition of his more than four decades of public service, including the State Department's Distinguished Service Medal on two separate occasions, the highest award which can be conferred by the Secretary of State, and on January 16, 2009, President Bush awarded Ambassador Negroponte the National Security Medal.

# **John Rogers**

Mr. Levie was awarded the Turnaround Management Association's 2017, 2018, and 2019 Turnaround of the Year Awards for the revival of Vermont Aerospace Industries, Canadian Kraft Paper Industries, and Union Metal Industries.

## **Libby Locke**

Libby Locke is one of the nation's most sought-after libel lawyers. She is a trusted counselor and fierce advocate for Fortune 100 companies and high-profile individuals facing existential reputational attacks from the national media and other influential publishers, achieving remarkable results for her clients both in and outside the courtroom. Court watchers have called her "as good as they get," and "aggressive and not afraid to litigate." After co-founding Clare Locke LLP in 2014, Libby rapidly rose to national prominence for a highly-publicized, multi-million-dollar trial victory against Rolling Stone magazine about a fabricated gang rape at the University of Virginia. In 2019, she won a \$26 million federal jury verdict on behalf of a North Carolina businessman who was defamed by a public company during a proxy fight. As a skilled appellate advocate, in 2019, Libby achieved a rare win against The New York Times on behalf of former Gov. Sarah Palin in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit. And in 2021, she secured a rare injunction and anti-SLAPP win against The New York Times on behalf of Project Veritas.

Libby is ranked Band 1 in the Chambers USA Guide for nationwide first amendment litigation and by Chambers High Net Worth in the category of global defamation/reputation management providers. She is regularly asked to speak on issues involving the First Amendment, media, and reputation, including publishing multiple op-eds in The Wall Street Journal and appearing as a guest on Fox News, CNN, and ABC's 20/20. Libby graduated from NYU's College of Arts and Science with a degree in Politics and Economics, and she received her J.D. from Georgetown University Law Center. Libby lives with her husband, Tom Clare, and their children in Alexandria, Virginia.

# Margaret I. Chustecki, MD

Dr. Margaret I. Chustecki is an Assistant Clinical Professor at Yale School of Medicine. Educated at Warsaw Medical School, she completed her training at Newton Wellesley Hospital and the New England Medical Center. Before starting her internal medicine practice in 2003, she worked as an Attending Physician for the Hospitalist Service at Yale New Haven Hospital.

Dr. Chustecki completed her MBA program at the Yale School of Management in 2009. This contributed to her founding and leading Internal Medicine of Greater New Haven, with 10 locations in Connecticut. Her medical team aims to improve efficiency, performance, and communication with patients and the public. She has implemented a quality program that achieved NCQA accreditation in eligible markets and

supported a quality infrastructure for additional programs, such as Meaningful Use and PQRS. She coordinates the team of medical providers to support medical education and collect data to improve patient outcomes, manage costs, and improve healthcare quality. She is the author and co-author of multiple medical publications, including the latest Essential Rationale Healthcare Economics: Past, Present, & Future by New York, Nova Science Publishers, Inc.

As an attending physician, Dr. Chustecki has taught interns and residents at Yale New Haven Hospital for many years. She has also taught and supervised medical students, PA students, and residents from YNHH in Internal Medicine of Greater New Haven offices.

In 2015, she co-founded Chase Medical Research of Greater New Haven and started to intensify her research activities. She is currently the chief clinical trial investigator for multi-institutional trials. This work began with a long-term outcome study to assess the effectiveness of adding an investigational drug to a multi-center, randomized, double-blind, active-controlled, parallel-group, and phase III trial. The trial evaluated the safety, efficacy, and comparison of add-on therapy with different doses of an investigational drug.

Dr. Chustecki serves on the Board of Advisors of Avara Pharma Services Ltd. and the Board of Directors of the D'Oyly Carte Foundation.

Previously, Caruso-Cabrera spent over 20 years at CNBC, where she was the network's first Latina anchor and long-time Chief International Correspondent. Throughout her career, Caruso-Cabrera reported live from around the world, covering a wide range of stories including the 2008 financial crisis, U.S. elections, the debt crisis in Greece, the Brexit vote, the European banking crisis, and Russia's first invasion of Ukraine in 2014. She has reported live from Ukraine, Russia, Iran, Cuba, Venezuela, Brazil, Mexico, and throughout Europe. She joined CNBC from WTSP-TV in St. Petersburg, Florida, where she spent four years as a general assignment reporter.

Prior to that, Caruso-Cabrera was a special projects producer for Univision where she covered Latin America, winning an Emmy for coverage of the AIDS crisis. She began her career in 1990 while at Wellesley College, as a stringer for The New York Times, reporting for the education section. Caruso-Cabrera has also been published in the Wall Street Journal and Washington Post, among other publications. The National Association of Hispanic Journalists awarded her "Broadcaster of the Year" and Hispanic Business magazine named her one of the "100 Most Influential Hispanics" in the country.

Caruso-Cabrera serves as President of the Ballet Hispánico Board of Directors and on the international advisory board of the IE Business School in Madrid, one of Europe's top business schools. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, the Economics Club of New York, the Latino Corporate Directors Association, and an active supporter of Manna of Life Ministries in The Bronx. She previously served as a director of The Beneficent Company Group, a privately-held company, from September 2018 to February 2020 before becoming a candidate for federal and city-level political office from 2020 to 2021. She served on the Transition Committee for New York City Mayor Eric Adams in 2021.

#### Patricia Duff

Patricia Duff is a prominent political activist, fundraiser for philanthropic causes, and founder of The Common Good, a nonpartisan, nonprofit prodemocracy organization that promotes greater citizen participation in civic life and the political process. In the late 1980s, Patricia started Show Coalition, a nonpartisan organization focused on the nexus between Washington politics and Hollywood. Patricia served as vice president of two of the country's leading political strategy and consulting firms in Washington, D.C., Squier-Eskew Communications and Patrick Caddell & Associates, has worked on numerous campaigns, including presidential and senate election efforts, served on an investigative committee for the U.S. House of Representatives, and has been an activist for a number of causes. Patricia was regularly cited in major publications such as the Washington Post, Los Angeles Times, and elsewhere on politics, and was named a "Rising Star" by the Los Angeles Times and as one of the "Women We Love" by *Esquire* magazine for her work in politics. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, the Board of Advisors for Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service, PEN America, the National Harbor Conservancy which oversees Federal Hall, and a former Presidential appointee to the Board of Trustees of the Library of Congress, among other boards, including National Public Radio, Save the Children, Lincoln Center Film Society, American Ballet Theater,

She co-hosted the first-ever television program dedicated to foreign-exchange markets, CNBC's "Money in Motion."

In 2023, together with co-counsel, Tom secured a \$787.5 million settlement from Fox News for his client, Dominion Voting Systems—the largest publicly known defamation settlement in U.S. history involving a media company. And in 2022, Tom secured a \$52.125 million defamation judgment before FINRA on behalf of client Daniel Micahlow against his former employer DE Shaw—the largest defamation award ever handed down by FINRA for a dispute within the industry. Tom is ranked Band 1 in the Chambers USA Guide for nationwide first amendment litigation and by Chambers High Net Worth in the category of global defamation and reputation management providers. Tom graduated from the University of Notre Dame with a BA in Government and from the University of Notre Dame Law School, where he was Editor-In-Chief of the Notre Dame Law Review. Tom lives with his wife and law firm partner, Libby Locke, and their children in Alexandria, Virginia.
